Tuition Fees

About Us

Tunghai University's Chinese Language Center (CLC) is situated on the western edge of the Dadu Mountain plain, within Tunghai University. CLC's location, nestled amongst beautiful trees, flowers, and bird songs, makes it an excellent place to learn Chinese.

Established in 1971 as the first language center in central Taiwan, CLC was initially intended to serve the family members of Tunghai's foreign faculty.

Later, its enrollment was expanded to include exchange students, missionaries, and people from all sectors of the society.

Course Introduction

CHINESE COURSES

1. Introductory, intermediate, and advanced classes offered.
2. Curriculum includes: conversation, reading, writing, business Chinese, newspaper and media classes, and literature classes.
3. Classes can be tailored to students' backgrounds and individual needs.
4. A variety of teaching materials and methods are used to develop speaking, listening, reading and writing skills.

CULTURE CLASSES

1. Extremely varied content includes: Taiwanese ballads, painting, the art of tea, Chinese calligraphy, history of Chinese characters, cultural festivals, traditional food and drink, temple and religious culture, Chinese novels, and Chinese opera.
2. From these various topics students are introduced to Chinese culture and Taiwanese customs.

DRAMA CLASS

Through physical exercises, dramatic games and role-play, the latent linguistic abilities of students are unlocked.

The body's energy is turned on, gathered and released; through expression, posture, movement, and interaction with others, communication skills improve and students develop.

Course content includes: script reading, physical exercises, vocal training, dramatic games, role-play, scene practice, and theater tours. Also, each class will conclude with a public performance.

SHORT TERM LANGUAGE AND CULTURE CLASSES

1. This program was developed for short term traveling students (university students or teens), and others courses from three to eight weeks of language and culture classes.
2. Each day includes 3 to 4 hours of Chinese language instruction, 2 tutorial hours, and is supplemented by culture classes and weekly excursions.
